Up to 95% course fees are claimable for Singaporeans under the Workfare Training Support (WTS) scheme.

Upon Completion of any modules, a Nationally Accredited **WSQ Statement of Attainment** would be awarded to the participant.

With Completion of all modules, a Nationally Accredited **WSQ Advanced Certificate in Food and Beverage Service** would be awarded to the participant.

All course fees listed include all training materials and are subjected to 7% GST.

Funding Scheme Available

There is no change to the existing application and claim process. Applicant companies should continue to apply for course fee and absentee payroll funding in the **SkillsConnect system**. The system will automatically apply the higher funding rates under WTS for eligible older low-wage workers.

Skills Development Fund (SDF) - The revised funding rates for courses pre-approved for funding under the SDF will take effect from 1 December 2010, as shown in Table 1 below. Funding for approved PMET courses will no longer be limited to Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs).

Workfare Training Support (WTS) - The changes will **not** affect older low-wage workers who are eligible for the Workfare Training Support (WTS) scheme which took effect on 1 July 2010. Employers who sponsor older low-wage workers for training under WTS will continue to enjoy enhanced course fee and absentee payroll funding. The Workfare Training Support (WTS) scheme employer grant is the funding support provided to cover part of the course fees payable as follows:

Employees who are Singapore Citizens	Course Fee Funding Support	Absentee Payroll Funding
≥ 35 years old; earning ≤ \$1,400 per month	95% (without dollar cap)	95% (without dollar cap)
≥ 35 years old; earning > \$1,400 to \$1,700 per month	90% (without dollar cap)	90% (without dollar cap)

Under the Workfare Training Support (WTS) scheme, there is also the Workfare Income Supplement (WIS). The Workfare Income Supplement (WIS) recipients are eligible for a \$200 Training Commitment Award (TCA) for every two Statements of Attainment (SOA) they obtain for Employability Skills or Workforce Skills Qualification (WSQ) training within a one-year rolling period, starting 1 July 2010. They are also eligible for an additional \$200 training commitment award if they obtain a full WSQ qualification. The total award that a worker can receive in a year is capped at \$400. The TCA will be paid automatically along with the recipient's WIS, as long as he fulfils the eligibility criteria. Recipients will be notified of their TCA and WIS payments in March and September through post every year.
